- **The Original BBQ Chicken**
Pizza: This iconic CPK creation can be made more Points-friendly by requesting a thin crust and asking for less cheese. The smoky BBQ sauce, chicken, and red onion provide plenty of flavor without needing a heavy cheese layer.
- **The Mushroom Pepperoni**
Sausage Pizza: Surprisingly, this meat-forward pizza can be a good option if you stick to a single slice. The lean protein from the meats helps with satiety, and the mushrooms add volume.
- **The Wild Mushroom Pizza:** For a vegetarian option that feels indulgent but is relatively light, this pizza features earthy mushrooms, a hint of truffle oil, and a light cheese blend. It is incredibly flavorful, meaning a single slice is often satisfying.

- **The Margherita Pizza:** A classic choice, the Margherita offers fresh mozzarella, basil, and tomato sauce. Requesting a thin crust and light cheese can keep this option very Points-friendly.

Customization Is the Secret Weapon

The single most effective strategy for managing Points at any restaurant is customization, and CPK is exceptionally accommodating. When ordering a pizza, you can request light cheese, no cheese, or even a cauliflower crust in many locations. The cauliflower crust is a game-changer for those on Weight Watchers, as it typically has fewer carbohydrates and a lower Points value than traditional wheat crust. You can also ask for extra vegetables as a topping to add volume and nutrients without adding significant Points. Do not hesitate to ask your server for a modified pizza; it is a standard request at CPK.

Beverages are a hidden source of Points for many diners. Alcoholic drinks, sodas, and specialty lemonades can add Points quickly. Stick with water, unsweetened iced tea, or a diet soda to save your Points for the food. If you want a cocktail, a glass of dry wine or a spirit with soda water and lime is the most Points-efficient choice.
