TROUBLESHOOTING COMMON ISSUES WITH THE COX CABLE GUIDE IN LAS VEGAS

- **Guide Not Loading or Blank Screen:** This often indicates a loss of signal or a need to reset your box. Unplug your Contour box for 30 seconds and plug it back in. This forces a fresh connection to the Cox network and usually resolves the issue.

- **Slow Navigation or Lag:** Over time, the guide's cache can become full. You can clear the cache by going into the settings menu (often under "System" or "Troubleshooting"). If the lag persists, a factory reset of your box might be necessary, but this will erase your settings and recordings.
- **Incorrect Show Times or Descriptions:** Sometimes the guide data can be slightly delayed. This is rare but can happen. Usually, it corrects itself within a few hours. If it continues, contacting Cox support is the best course of action, as your guide data source may need to be refreshed.

COMPARING THE COX CABLE GUIDE WITH OTHER PROVIDERS IN LAS VEGAS
