

- simple. Intricate details are hard to draw freehand. A small symbol, word, or geometric shape works best.
2. **Prepare the skin:** Clean with rubbing alcohol to remove oils.
 3. **Draw the design:** Use gentle strokes. If you make a mistake, remove it with a cotton swab dipped in rubbing alcohol and start again.
 4. **Let it dry:** Wait 2 to 3 minutes for the ink to set.
 5. **Set the tattoo:** Lightly dust with baby powder to matte the finish. Alternatively, spray a fine mist of setting spray or hairspray from a distance. Do not oversaturate.
 6. **Blend the edges:** Use a small brush and a tiny amount of powder to soften the edges so the tattoo blends with your skin tone.
- Hand-drawn tattoos are temporary and will wash off with soap and water. They are great for one-day events or for testing placement before using a more permanent method.

METHOD 3: EYESHADOW OR BODY PAINT TECHNIQUE

This method creates a softer, more artistic look that mimics the appearance of a real tattoo. It is excellent for larger designs or for achieving a watercolor effect. You can use
