For countless trainers who journeyed through the Unova region in **Pokémon Black Version**, the allure of capturing legendary Pokémon has always been the ultimate endgame challenge. These rare and powerful creatures are not just trophies; they are central to the game's lore, often possessing world-altering abilities. Yet, obtaining every single legendary Pokémon in a single copy of the game can be an almost impossible task without trading or using special event distributions. This is where the world of **Pokemon Black Legendary Codes** comes into play. Whether you are revisiting the game for a nostalgic playthrough or discovering it for the first time, understanding these codes can unlock a menagerie of mythical and legendary creatures that would otherwise remain out of reach. This guide will walk you through everything you need to know, from Action Replay cheat codes to the fan-made revival of the old Wi-Fi event distributions.

What Exactly Are Pokemon Black Legendary Codes?

Broadly speaking, the term "legendary codes" refers to two distinct methods of obtaining rare Pokémon in Pokémon Black. The first, and most well-known among purists, are Action Replay cheat codes. These are alphanumeric strings entered into a physical device to modify the game's memory, instantly spawning legendary Pokémon like Reshiram or Zekrom in your party or PC. The second, and arguably more interesting method, involves the use of "Event Codes" or "Wonder Card" data. During the game's active lifespan, Nintendo distributed special Pokémon via the Nintendo Wi-Fi Connection. Today, fan-operated servers have revived this service, allowing you to receive these event Pokémon through a modified DNS setting. This article will cover both methods in detail, giving you a complete toolkit.

Method One: The Classic Action Replay Approach

For many veteran players, the Action Replay DS was the golden key to the Pokémon universe. It allowed you to bypass traditional gameplay restrictions. When we talk about **Pokemon Black Legendary Codes** in the context of Action Replay, we are referring to specific codes that trigger the game to load a legendary Pokémon directly into your party. It is crucial to remember that using these codes will alter your game save file, and they should be used with caution. Always backup your save data before applying any cheat codes.

How to Use Action Replay Codes for Legendaries

To use these codes, you will need an Action Replay DS or DS2 device and a microSD card. You input the master code (usually required for the device to function) followed by the specific code for the Pokémon you want. Here is the general process:

- Download the code database** or manually create a new cheat entry on your device.
- Enter the Master Code** (usually something like 94000130 FCFF0000 or a similar universal code).
- Enter the specific legendary code** (see examples below).
- Insert the game cartridge** and boot up the Action Replay menu.
- Select the cheat** and start the game.
- Trigger the code** (often by pressing a specific button combination like L+R) to spawn the Pokémon.

Popular Action Replay Legendary Codes

Below are some of the most sought-after codes for Pokémon Black. These codes will typically place the Pokémon directly into the first slot of your party. **Please note:** Code structures can vary based on your Action Replay firmware version. The following are standard examples for the North American (U) version of Pokémon Black.

- Reshiram:** 521E1E00 0044381C E2001000 00000088 0A0A0A0A 0A0A0A0A 00000000 00000033 00000000 00000033 DCB0A001 00000000 2D1301FE 7BBAA840 30683261 73B090C4 1000E004 00000000 D2000000 00000000
- Zekrom:** A similar string of hex digits, often ending with a specific checksum for the Pokémon's data.
- Kyurem:** Codes for the original dragon are often used to complete the Tao trio.
- Victini (Mythical):** This Pokémon was exclusive to an early event. Action Replay codes allowed players to obtain it without the ticket.
- Legendary Beasts (Raikou, Entei, Suicune):** Though available in the Entralink after defeating the Elite Four, codes could spawn them instantly at any level.
- Creation Trio (Dialga, Palkia, Giratina):** Native to the Sinnoh region, these were not catchable in Black without transfer or cheats.
- Weather Trio (Groudon, Kyogre, Rayquaza):** Highly coveted for their primal abilities, these were often requested.

Important Caveat: Action Replay codes can sometimes cause game glitches. For example, spawning a Pokémon with an illegal moveset or in an unreachable location can corrupt your save. Always check that the code is specifically compatible with your game version (e.g., Pokemon Black NTR-ADA5 or similar).

Method Two: The DNS Exploit – Getting Official Event Legendaries

If you prefer a more "legitimate" method that does not involve third-party hardware, the DNS exploit is your best option. This method does not require you to install cheats onto the game. Instead, it fools your Nintendo DS into connecting to a private server that still distributes the old official event Wonder Cards. This is the most exciting development in **Pokemon Black Legendary Codes** in recent years, as it grants you access to **legitimate event Pokémon** with their correct ribbons, moves, and hidden abilities.

How the DNS Exploit Works

Nintendo discontinued the Nintendo Wi-Fi Connection service in 2014. However, fans noticed that the authentication method used by the DS was relatively simple. Community-run servers now mimic the official servers. When you try to receive a "Gift" over Nintendo WFC, your DS connects to these fan servers instead, allowing you to download the event data.

Setting Up the DNS Exploit for Legendary Event Pok  mon

Follow these steps to unlock event legendaries in Pokémon Black:

- Check your internet router.** The Nintendo DS only supports WEP encryption or no encryption. If your router uses WPA2 (common today), you will need to create a mobile hotspot with no password or use an older router.
- Access your DS Wi-Fi settings.** From the Pokémon Black title screen, go to *Nintendo WFC Settings*.
- Select an empty connection slot.** Instead of searching for an access point, choose *Manual Setup*.
- Find your Access Point.** Your DS should see your router (or hotspot). Select it.
- Change the DNS settings.** This is the crucial step. Set **Auto-Obtain DNS** to **No**. Then, enter the primary DNS as 178.62.43.212. This is a well-known public server (often called the "Wiimfi" or "PokeClassic" server). Leave the secondary DNS as 0.0.0.0.
- Save the settings** and perform a connection test. It should succeed.
- Boot up Pokémon Black** and select *Mystery Gift* > *Receive from Nintendo WFC*.
- Watch the magic happen.** You will be able to download event Pokémon. The distribution cycles through a list of available events. You are not guaranteed a specific legendary every time, but the list includes many.

Available Legendaries via the DNS Exploit

The fan servers generally cycle through all the Global Terminal distributions from the Gen IV and Gen V era. For Pokémon Black, this includes some incredible legendary and mythical creatures:

- **Victini (Liberty Island Event Equivalent)**
- **Celebi (Time Travel Event)**
- **Mew (Various Wi-Fi Events)**
- **Shiny Raikou, Entei, and Suicune (Zoroark Mastery Events)**
- **Dialga, Palkia, and Giratina (Sinjoh Ruins Connection Events)**
- **Arceus (Azure Fluff Event - though mostly for HeartGold/SoulSilver, it occasionally appears in the Gen V pool)**
- **Genesect (Plasma Event)**

This method is widely considered safe for your game save. However, like all glitches, you risk a small chance of a corrupted Wonder Card if the connection cuts out mid-transfer.

Comparing the Two Methods: Cheats vs. Events

When researching **Pokemon Black Legendary Codes**, you will find strong opinions on both sides. Here is a simple breakdown to help you decide which method is right for you.

Action Replay Codes:

- **Pros:** Instant access to any Pokémon, ability to customize IVs and movesets, no need for working Wi-Fi.
- **Cons:** Risks save corruption, Pokémon are flagged as "hacked" in some trading communities, requires physical hardware.

DNS Exploit:

- **Pros:** Receives 100% legitimate event Pokémon with correct data, no hardware needed, safe for your save file, includes rare shiny distributions.
- **Cons:** Requires a WEP or open Wi-Fi network, you cannot choose which Pokémon you get (it cycles through a queue), slower than cheats.

Safety Precautions and Ethical Considerations

Using **Pokemon Black Legendary Codes** is a personal choice. If you intend to trade these Pokémon online today (via the limited services available or through transferring to Pokémon Bank and later to Pokémon HOME), you should be aware of "legality checks." The Pokémon Bank has a hack checker. A Pokémon obtained via a poorly written Action Replay code (e.g., an illegal ball combination, a move it cannot learn, or a wrong level) will be flagged and cannot be transferred. The DNS exploit, however, produces Pokémon that pass these checks because they are identical to the original events. If you are a collector who values having legitimate data, the DNS method is superior.
