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DISCOVERING THE HIDDEN GEM OF UNOVA: THE NATURE PRESERVE IN POKÉMON BLACK 2 AND WHITE 2

Unova is a region full of secrets, from the bustling streets of Castelia City to the eerie stillness of the Giant Chasm. But few locations feel as rewarding—or as well-hidden—as the **Nature Preserve**. If you are

exploring the post-game and searching for rare Pokémon, a powerful Haxorus, or just a peaceful place to fish and catch Pokémon in rustling grass, this secluded area is a must-visit. Many players search for **Pokemon Black And White 2 How To Go To Nature Preserve** guides because the path is not immediately obvious. This article will walk you through every step, ensuring you unlock this hidden sanctuary without any confusion.

What Makes the Nature Preserve So Special?

Before you set out on your journey, it helps to understand exactly what you are working toward. The Nature Preserve is a small, enclosed area located on the easternmost edge of the Unova region. It is accessible only after you have completed the main story and fulfilled a few specific requirements. Inside, you will find a

unique environment where wild Pokémon appear in rustling grass patches, and more importantly, you can encounter a **shiny Haxorus**—though you will need to work for it.

The preserve is also one of the few places in the game where you can find Pokémon like **Eevee** in the wild, along with several other species that are otherwise unavailable or very rare. For completionists and shiny hunters, this location is a top priority.

PREREQUISITES: WHAT YOU MUST DO BEFORE GOING

You cannot simply walk to the Nature Preserve right after starting the game. The area is locked behind a substantial post-game

gate. Here is everything you need to have accomplished first:

- **Become the Champion of Unova:** You must defeat the Elite Four and the Champion in the main story. This triggers the credits and opens up the post-game world.
- **Obtain the National Pokédex:** After becoming Champion, return to **Nuvema Town** and speak with Professor Juniper. She will upgrade your Unova Pokédex to the National Pokédex. This is essential.
- **Talk to Cedric Juniper:** This is the step many

players miss. Professor Juniper's father, Cedric Juniper, is standing outside her lab in Nuvema Town. You must speak with him to receive the **HMs or key items** needed for the journey. He will mention the Nature Preserve and give you the **Dive Ball** as a gift, but more importantly, he opens the dialogue that allows you to progress.

- **Unlock Route 17 and Route 18:** These routes are blocked during the main story. After becoming Champion and speaking with

Cedric, the barriers will be removed, granting you access to the southeastern part of Unova.

If you have done all of the above, you are ready to begin the actual trek to the preserve.

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE: HOW TO REACH THE NATURE PRESERVE

Now that you have met the prerequisites, let us break down the exact path you need to follow. This route is the answer to **Pokemon Black And White 2 How To Go To Nature Preserve**.

Step 1:

Start from Nuvema Town

Fly or walk to **Nuvema Town**. This is the town where your journey began, and it is the closest central point for this expedition. Make sure your Pokémon are healed and that you have plenty of Repels if you want to avoid random encounters on the way.

Step 2: Head South to

Route 1

From Nuvema Town, exit to the south and enter **Route 1**. Follow the path downward until you reach the water's edge. You will need a Pokémon that knows **Surf** to continue. If you do not have one, teach it to a suitable Water-type Pokémon before you leave.

Step 3: Surf to Route 17

Surf across the water south of Route 1. You will eventually reach the shore of **Route 17**. This route is a narrow strip of land and water that runs eastward. Follow the path along the coastline, surfing

when necessary. Route 17 is fairly straightforward, but it does have a few trainers. You can avoid them if you want to rush, but the battles are low-level at this point.

Step 4: Enter the Seaside Cave

At the end of Route 17, you will encounter the entrance to the **Seaside Cave**. This is a small cave that connects Route 17 to Route 18. The cave is very short and has no major puzzles, but it is dark, so bring a Pokémon with **Flash** if you have trouble seeing. Alternatively,

you can simply feel your way through. The cave is linear, so you cannot get lost.

Inside the Seaside Cave, you may encounter wild Pokémon such as **Woobat** or **Zubat**. Use Repels if you want to speed through.

Step 5: Arrive at Route 18

After exiting the Seaside Cave, you will emerge on **Route 18**. This is a small, sunny beach area. There is a house here belonging to a scientist who gives you the **Amulet Coin** if you talk to him. Feel free to grab that, but your main goal is to continue east.

Route 18 is very short.

Walk to the eastern edge of the beach until you see a grassy area and a small patch of trees. This is the entrance to the **Nature Preserve**.

Step 6: Enter the Nature Preserve

Simply step into the grass at the eastern end of Route 18, and the game will transition you into the Nature Preserve. There is no gate, no guard, no puzzle—just a seamless entry. You have arrived.

WHAT TO DO INSIDE THE NATURE PRESERVE

Once you are inside,

take a moment to appreciate the scenery. The Nature Preserve is a small, enclosed area with tall grass, a pond, and a few trees. It feels serene and untouched. Here is what you can do:

Find the Shiny Haxorus

The main attraction of the Nature Preserve is the **shiny Haxorus**. Deep in the tall grass at the far end of the preserve, you will find a rustling grass patch. Interact with it, and a wild Haxorus will appear. This Haxorus is guaranteed to be shiny, meaning it has the distinctive black and red coloration

instead of the usual green. It is a one-time encounter, so make sure you are prepared.

Tips for catching the shiny Haxorus:

- **Save before entering the grass.** If you accidentally knock it out, you can reset and try again.
- Bring a Pokémon with **False Swipe** to weaken it without fainting it.
- Use **Dusk Balls** or **Timer Balls** for the best catch rate. The Haxorus is level 60, so it is not too difficult to catch if you are prepared.
- Consider using a move that puts it to sleep or

paralyzes it to improve your odds.

Hunt for Rare Pokémon in Rustling Grass

Beyond the Haxorus, the Nature Preserve is famous for its rustling grass patches. These patches appear randomly as you walk through the tall grass. When you step on a rustling patch, you have a chance to encounter rare Pokémon that do not appear anywhere else in Unova. Some of the

highlights include:

- **Eevee** – Eevee is notoriously difficult to find in the wild in Generation V. The Nature Preserve is one of the few places you can catch one without trading or breeding.
- **Riolu** – Another rare find, Riolu can appear in rustling grass here.
- **Pikachu** – Yes, Pikachu is also available in the preserve.
- **Mareep, Yanma, and other rare species** – The exact encounters depend on the version of the game (Black 2 or White 2), but the rustling grass

mechanic makes hunting here very rewarding.

To maximize your chances of finding rustling grass, walk back and forth across the preserve. The patches will appear randomly. Use the **Repel trick** (using a Repel while having a low-level Pokémon in the lead) to avoid common encounters and force rustling grass encounters to appear more frequently.

Fish in the Pond

The small pond in the Nature Preserve is also worth a look. Using a **Super Rod**, you can fish up Pokémon like **Dratini** and **Dragonair** in some versions. This is

another excellent opportunity to catch rare Dragon-type Pokémon if you do not already have them.

IMPORTANT TIPS FOR YOUR VISIT

Here are a few additional pieces of advice to make your trip to the Nature Preserve as smooth as possible:

- **Stock up on Poké Balls.** The shiny Haxorus and the rare rustling grass Pokémon are worth catching, so bring a variety of balls, including Dusk Balls, Ultra Balls, and Timer Balls.
- **Bring a Pokémon with Synchronize.** If you are hunting for a specific

nature on the Haxorus or other rare Pokémon, lead with a Pokémon that has the Synchronize ability. This gives you a 50% chance of the wild Pokémon having the same nature.

- **Use a Pokémon with Compound Eyes for better item drops.** The wild Pokémon here sometimes hold items, though this is secondary to catching them.
- **The preserve is tiny.** Do not expect a sprawling area. It is a small, concentrated zone designed for specific encounters.

Enjoy the tranquility.

- **Leave and re-enter to reset rustling grass.** If you catch the Haxorus or clear the rustling grass, you can leave the preserve and re-enter to refresh the encounters.

COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT THE NATURE PRESERVE

Can I get back to the Nature

Preserve after leaving?

Yes. Once you unlock it, you can return anytime by following the same route from Nuvema Town through Route 1, Route 17, the Seaside Cave, and Route 18. The entrance remains open permanently.

Is the shiny Haxorus guaranteed?

Yes. The Haxorus in the Nature Preserve is a

fixed shiny encounter. It will always be shiny, regardless of how many times you reset or how many soft resets you do. It is a guaranteed shiny, making it one of the most accessible shiny Pokémon in the entire game.

What level is the Haxorus?

The Haxorus is level 60. It knows Dragon Dance, Dragon Claw, Swords Dance, and Earthquake. Be careful—it can hit hard if you are not prepared. Bring a Pokémon that resists Dragon and Ground moves.
