brought back many classic characters as "Senseis" and introduced new ones like King Pen, Starcast, and Wolfgang. Your **Skylanders Character List** for Imaginators should include all Senseis, as each one unlocks a unique battle class and Imaginator creation part.

TIPS FOR COMPLETING YOUR COLLECTION

Organize Your Checklist by Game and Element
